**California Fire Incident Reporting System Manual, CSM-4419/00-TC-02
San Ramon Valley Fire Protection District & City of Newport Beach, Claimants
July 1990 California Fire Incident Reporting System Manual;
Health and Safety Code Section 13110.5 as Amended by Statutes 1987, Chapter 345**

The State Fire Marshal requests the correction of the record with the removal from consideration of the Commission the reference on page 12 of "Item 7, Test Claim Final Staff Analysis" distributed November 21, 2006, footnote Number 23, referencing <http://osfm.fire.ca.gov/cfirs.html>. The referenced statement, "the information is used to help fire departments target their resources and education programs, as well as develop and support fire safety legislation" does not apply to the CFIRS. This statement is relevant to the "California All Incident Reporting System (CAIRS). CAIRS is the current method used by the State Fire Marshal to collect data in the National Fire Incident Reporting System (NFIRS) format and any reference should not be included in the CFIRS Test Claim. Discontinuation of the use of CFIRS to collect data was phased out during a period of many years, with complete transition to CAIRS on January 1, 2003.

Additionally, on page 13 of the above-referenced Final Staff Analysis, it is important to emphasize the statement, which states in part, "... Staff finds that the amended statutory language only specifies that local fire departments *may*, also furnish information and data to the State Fire Marshal relating to medical aid incidents and hazardous materials incidents which occur within their area of jurisdiction.' All other amendments to the code section are directives to the State Fire Marshal, or fire departments operated by the State..." While it could be argued that during 1990-1992 there may have been information that was unclear, any requirements of reporting information can never extend beyond the applicable Health and Safety Code and, further, it is the responsibility of all to be aware of, understand and follow the statute.

Finally, it should be noted that automating the data enabled the State Fire Marshal to offer a service to the fire departments by stripping the Hazardous Materials (HazMat) information from the records and reporting it to the Governor's Office of Emergency Services (OES). Therefore, the fire departments reporting on computer or magnetic tape derived a benefit in that the HazMat information was forwarded to OES, thereby relieving the need to report HazMat on a separate form to OES.

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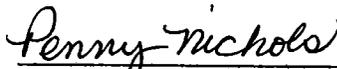
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
