EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT - REVISED

Budget, Workload Update and Tentative Agenda Items for the March 2025 and May 2025 Meetings (info)

I. The Commission's 2025-2026 Budget

The Governor introduced his proposed 2025-2026 budget on January 10, 2025. The Commission's 2025-2026 operating budget as proposed in the Governor's Budget is \$3,438,000 and is broken down as: \$2,981,000 for Personal Services and \$457,000 for Operating Expenses and Equipment. This is a decrease of \$124,000 from the total appropriation of \$3,562,000 for 2024-2025 after adjustments for salaries and benefits of \$33,000.

The Governor's Budget also includes \$91,456,000 for Local Assistance or local agency mandated programs - a decrease of \$40,771,000 from the 2024-2025 budget of \$132,227,000.

II. Regulations Update

The subject of our 2025 Rulemaking will be a full review and update of the Commission's regulations to ensure clarity, consistency, and ease of use of the Commission's process for receiving and hearing claims. To this end, staff has prepared draft proposed amendments which will be reviewed and discussed with local and state agencies at an informal conference, which will be set in February. After reviewing the informal conference feedback and making any necessary changes, staff will have the proposed language and the order to initiate a rulemaking package for the Commission's consideration at the March 2025 hearing.
