## **GENERAL CLEANUP PROVISIONS**

#### PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO

CALIFORNIA CODE OF REGULATIONS, TITLE 2, DIVISION 2, CHAPTER 2.5

#### ARTICLES 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, AND 10 SECTIONS 1181.1 THROUGH 1188.2 AND 1190 THROUGH 1190.5

### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The purpose of this rulemaking is to: (1) clarify and streamline Commission on State Mandates (Commission) regulations; (2) eliminate duplicative language; and (3) update authority and reference citations.

At its regular meeting on January 23 2015, the Commission adopted Order No. 15-01 to institute rulemaking proceedings in accordance with Government Code sections 11346.2, 11346.4, 11346.8, and 11346.9.

The proposed text was made available to the public for 45 days from February 6, 2015 through March 23, 2015. The last day to request a public hearing was March 9, 2015, and no request was received. As of the writing of this staff report, no comments have been received. Therefore this proposed order of adoption is a tentative agenda item. Only if no substantive written comments are received by the March 23, 2015 deadline will the Commission take action on this item.

Pursuant to Government Code section 11346.9(a)(4), staff finds that no alternative would be more effective in carrying out the purpose for which the regulations are proposed or would be as effective as and less burdensome to affected private persons than the proposed regulations.

#### **Staff Recommendation**

Therefore, staff recommends that the Commission:

- Find that no alternative would be more effective in carrying out the purpose for which the regulations are proposed or would be as effective as and less burdensome to affected private persons than the proposed regulations.
- Adopt the proposed amendments to California Code of Regulations, Title 2, Division 2, Chapter 2.5, Articles 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 10, effective July 1, 2015.
- Authorize staff to make any non-substantive, technical corrections requested by the Office of Administrative Law or Barclays Official California Code of Regulations prior to publication.
