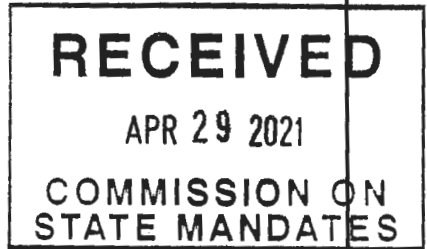
ADJOURNMENT

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3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: It is 10:01, and the meeting
4 of the Commission on State Mandates will come to order.
5 Welcome and thank you to everyone for participating via
6 Zoom. I think this is our one-year anniversary of a
7 Zoom meeting, although I think we actually missed our
8 March of 2020 meeting, when we didn't know what was
9 happening with everything.

10 Please note that in response to COVID-19 and its
11 impact on public meetings, under the Bagley-Keene Open
12 Meeting Act, Governor Newsom's Executive Order N-29-20
13 suspends, on an emergency basis, pursuant to California
14 Government Code 8571, certain requirements for public
15 meetings.

16 Accordingly, requiring the physical presence of
17 board members at public meetings and providing a
18 physical space for members of the public to observe and
19 participate have been suspended until further notice, so
20 long as the agency makes it possible for members of the
21 public to observe and address the meeting remotely; for
22 example, via web or audio conferencing, such as we're
23 doing today on Zoom.

24 The Commission is committed -- because we have an
25 amazing team -- to ensuring that our public meetings are

1 accessible to the public and that the public has the
2 opportunity to observe the meeting and to participate by
3 providing written and verbal comment on Commission
4 matters.

5 During this extraordinary time, and as we explore
6 new ways of doing business with new technologies, we ask
7 that you remain patient with us.

8 Please note that materials for today's meeting,
9 including the notice, agenda, and witness list, are all
10 available on the Commission's website, which is at
11 www.csm.ca.gov under the "Hearings" tab.

12 Ms. Halsey, will you please call the roll.

13 MS. HALSEY: Sure.

14 Mr. Adams.

15 MEMBER ADAMS: Here.

16 MS. HALSEY: Ms. Lee.

17 MEMBER LEE: Here.

18 MS. HALSEY: Ms. Miller.

19 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Here.

20 MS. HALSEY: Ms. Olsen.

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Great. We have a quorum.
2 Thank you, everyone, being here, and it's always a
3 pleasure to see all of you.

4 The next is Item Number 1.

5 Are there any corrections or objections to the
6 minutes of the January 22nd meeting?

7 MEMBER OLSEN: Move adoption.

8 MEMBER LEE: Second.

9 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Thank you, Ms. Olsen. Thank
10 you, Mr. Adams.

11 There's a motion and a second.

12 All those in favor of adopting the minutes, signify
13 by saying "aye."

14 (Ayes)

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Thank you.

16 Any objections?

17 (No response)

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Any abstentions?

19 (No response)

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Great. Thank you very much.

21 The minutes are adopted.

22 And we will now move to public comment.

23 MS. HALSEY: We will now take up public comment for
24 matters not on the agenda. Please note that the
25 Commission cannot take action on items not on the

1 agenda. However, it can schedule issues raised by the
2 public for consideration at future meetings.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Great. Thank you very much.

4 Is there any public comment? Anybody wishing to
5 speak for any reason?

6 MS. PALCHIK: I see no hands, Madam Chair.

7 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Great. Thank you so much,
8 Ms. Palchik.

9 We'll move on, then, to the next item, please.

10 MS. HALSEY: Next item is the Article 7 portion of
11 the hearing. There are no items on consent today.

12 Now will the parties and witnesses for Item 3
13 please turn on your video, unmute your microphones, and
14 please rise.

15 (Parties/witnesses stood to be sworn or
16 affirmed.)

17 MS. HALSEY: Item 2 is reserved for appeals of
18 executive director decisions, and there are no appeals
19 to consider for this hearing.

20 Next is Item 3. The claimant for this matter has
21 informed Commission staff that they do not intend to
22 appear. Senior Commission Counsel Eric Feller will
23 please turn on his video, unmute his microphone, and
24 present a proposed decision on an incorrect reduction
25 claim on the Stull Act.

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Please proceed, Mr. Feller.
2 Thank you.

3 MR. FELLER: Good morning.

4 This IRC challenges the State Controller's
5 reduction to reimbursement claims filed by the
6 Fairfield-Suisun Unified School District for the Stull
7 Act Program for fiscal years 2005-08 and 2010-2013.
8 Parameters and guidelines authorize reimbursement for
9 adding criteria to the already required written
10 evaluations for certificated instructional personnel,
11 and for adding an assessment and written evaluation
12 every other year for certificated employees who
13 previously received a nonsatisfactory evaluation.

14 Based on this record, the staff finds that the
15 Controller's reduction of salary and benefit costs is
16 correct, as a matter of law, because the claimant did
17 not provide contemporaneous source documentation to
18 support the time devoted to the reimbursable activities
19 as required by the parameters and guidelines.

20 Staff also finds there's no evidence in the record
21 that the Controller's allowance of 60 minutes per
22 evaluation is arbitrary, capricious, or entirely lacking
23 in evidentiary supports.

24 Staff recommends the Commission adopt the proposed
25 decision to deny the IRC and to authorize staff to make

1 any technical, nonsubstantive changes to the proposed
2 decision following the hearing.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Great. Thank you so much, Mr.
4 Feller.

5 Mr. Howell, will you please state your full name.

6 MR. HOWELL: Yes. Ken Howell, State Controller's
7 Office, Division of Audits. I was the audit manager for
8 this engagement.

9 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Great. Thank you so much.

10 And as Ms. Halsey, we don't -- the representative
11 for Fairfield-Suisun will not be testifying today.

12 Do you have any comments, Mr. Howell?

13 MR. HOWELL: Not at this time.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Great. Thank you for that.

15 Are there any public comments on this item?

16 MS. PALCHIK: Seeing none, Madam Chair.

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Great. Thank you very much.

18 Any questions from the Board? Any further
19 discussion?

20 (No response)

21 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: No? Is there a motion?

22 MEMBER ADAMS: Madam Chair --

23 MEMBER OLSEN: I will move adoption of the -- of
24 the staff recommendation.

25 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Thank you, all at once. I

1 think that was moved by Ms. Olsen and seconded by
2 Ms. Wong-Hernandez; is that right?

3 (No response)

4 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Thank you very much.

5 Ms. Halsey, may we please call the vote to adopt
6 the staff recommendation?

7 MS. HALSEY: Yes.

8 Mr. Adams.

9 MEMBER ADAMS: Aye.

10 MS. HALSEY: Ms. Lee.

11 MEMBER LEE: Aye.

12 MS. HALSEY: Ms. Miller.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Aye.

14 MS. HALSEY: Ms. Olsen.

15 MEMBER OLSEN: Aye.

16 MS. HALSEY: Mr. Walker.

17 MEMBER WALKER: Aye.

18 MS. HALSEY: Ms. Wong-Hernandez.

19 MEMBER WONG-HERNANDEZ: Aye.

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: That motion carries.

21 And now we'll move to our next item, please.

22 MS. HALSEY: Yes. We ask that presenters for
23 Item 3 to please turn off their videos and mute their
24 microphones.

25 Item 4 is reserved for county applications for a

1 finding of significant financial distress, or SB 1033
2 applications. No SB 1033 applications have been filed.

3 Next is Item 5. Program Analyst Kerry Ortman will
4 please turn on her video and microphone and present Item
5 5, the Legislative Update.

6 MS. ORTMAN: Good morning.

7 AB 1013, State mandates: claims, proposes reducing
8 the statutorily mandated minimum amount of costs
9 incurred to file a mandate reimbursement claim from
10 \$1,000 to \$900. On March 4th this bill was referred to
11 the Assembly Committee on Local Government.

12 The bill contains the same language as a 2020 spot
13 bill, AB 2395, State mandates: claims, which staff
14 tracked last year. Staff will continue to monitor
15 legislation for bills that impact the mandates process.

16 And that's all I have for you.

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Thank you very much.

18 Any questions for Ms. Ortman?

19 (No response)

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Seeing none, we will move on
21 to the Chief Legal Counsel Report.

22 MS. HALSEY: Item 6 is the Chief Legal Counsel
23 Report, and Camille Shelton will please turn on her
24 video and microphone and present Item 6.

25 MS. SHELTON: Good morning. I don't have any new

1 filings or recent decisions to report for this hearing.

2 We do have one claim that is scheduled for hearing
3 in the County of San Diego Superior Court for
4 August 6th, 2021. That is County of San Diego versus
5 Commission on State Mandates, which challenges the
6 Commission's decision on the Youth Offender Parole
7 Hearings test claim.

8 And that's all I have.

9 MS. HALSEY: Thank you.

10 Next is the Executive Director's Report.

11 For my report today, the governor introduced the
12 budget in January, as you know, and it proposed funding
13 for the Commission's operational budget at essentially
14 the same level as for 2019, with a very small
15 enhancement for increased OE&E costs. And the budget --
16 the Commission's budget for local assistance -- the
17 other portion of the budget that's for mandate
18 reimbursement -- has been heard in both the assembly and
19 the senate, but the operational budget has yet to be
20 heard in the legislature.

21 I'm not actually sure, but I think they might be
22 doing all operational budgets as part of negotiations
23 this year, with the administration, since they have
24 separated them out.

25 Anyway, that's the status, and we'll update that as

1 we get more information.

2 For Mandates, though, the funding was proposed
3 essentially to be the same as for 2019 except that the
4 new mandates which the Commission has found over the
5 last year are proposed to be funded at the higher end of
6 the range and the statewide cost estimates recently
7 adopted by the Commission.

8 With regard to workload, after this hearing, we'll
9 have 42 test claims pending. 39 of those are regarding
10 stormwater, and we have a -- sorry. I think it's 11
11 IRCs pending and seven -- no. I'm sorry. I'm saying
12 that wrong. It's more than 11. Anyway, there are seven
13 consolidated together, and I think there's 11 total for
14 hearing. And we're going to be hearing that
15 consolidated one at the next hearing. It's been issued
16 for comment.

17 And that is all I have on workload for now.

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Great. Thank you very much
19 for that.

20 Any questions for Ms. Halsey?

21 (No response)

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Any public comment for either
23 Ms. Halsey or Ms. Shelton?

24 MS. PALCHIK: I see none, Madam Chair.

25 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Great. Thank you very much.

1 Now we will meet in closed executive session,
2 pursuant to Government Code section 11126(e) to confer
3 with and receive advice from legal counsel for
4 consideration and action, as necessary and appropriate,
5 upon the pending litigation listed on the published
6 notice and agenda; and to confer with and receive advice
7 from legal counsel regarding potential litigation. The
8 Commission will also confer on personnel matters
9 pursuant to Government Code section 11126(a)(1). And we
10 will reconvene open session in approximately 15 minutes
11 or less.

12 So Ms. Palchik, I believe, sent the closed session
13 link. And perhaps -- I cannot find it readily. So I
14 know she's going to send it again for those of us that
15 are in the same boat. So we'll leave this Zoom.

16 MS. HALSEY: I just resent it, so you should be
17 receiving an e-mail from me.

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Thank you so much. I
19 apologize for that.

20 So we're going to leave this Zoom and then come
21 back after closed session in 15 minutes. So thank you,
22 everyone, and we'll return shortly.

23 (Closed session was held from
24 10:12 a.m. to 10:33 a.m.)

25 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: We will reconvene in open

1 session.

2 The Commission met in closed executive session
