Testimony at the Commission Hearing. If you plan to address the Commission on an agenda item, please notify the Commission Office **not later than noon on the Tuesday prior to the hearing, June 9, 2026.** Please also include the names of the people who will be speaking for inclusion on the witness list and the names and email addresses of the people who will be speaking both in person and remotely to receive a hearing panelist link in Zoom. When calling or emailing, please identify the item you want to testify on and the entity you represent. The Commission Chairperson reserves the right to impose time limits on presentations as may be necessary to complete the agenda.

Any person may submit comments in writing on any agenda item by filing them in accordance with section 1181.3 of the Commission's regulations. If you plan to file any written document, please note that comments filed at least 15 days in advance of the meeting shall be included in the Commissioners' hearing binders, a copy of which is available for public viewing at the Commission meeting. Additionally, comments filed more than five days in advance of the meeting shall be included in the Commission's meeting binders, if feasible, or shall be provided to the Commission when the item is called, unless otherwise agreed by the Commission or the executive director. (Cal. Code Regs., tit. 2, § § 1181.3 and 1181.10(b)(1)(A-B)).

However, written comments filed less than five days in advance of the meeting, the commenter shall electronically file (or e-file) a PDF copy with the Commission via the Commission's e-filing system, available on the Commission's website <https://www.csm.ca.gov/dropbox.shtml> at least 24 hours prior to the meeting.

Commission staff shall provide copies of the comments to the Commission and shall place a copy on a table for public review when the item is called or, in the case of participation via teleconference, shall provide an electronic copy to the Commission and post a copy on the Commission's website, and may share the document with the Commission and the public using the "share" function. (Cal. Code Regs., tit. 2, § § 1181.3 and 1181.10(b)(1)(C)).
