EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Proposed 2024 Hearing Calendar, Workload Update, and Tentative Agenda Items for the October 2023 and December 2023 Meetings (info/action)

I. New Commission Staff

Since the Commission's last meeting, our former Assistant Executive Director, Heidi Palchik has left the Commission for a promotion at the Office of Emergency Services, and we have hired two new staff members.

Joseph Ortiz, Information Specialist I. Joseph graduated Magna Cum Laude from Arizona State University earning a BA in Interdisciplinary Studies, with a minor in IT. In addition to his degree, he has obtained several IT certifications, including Exchange 365, Intune, SCCM, Group Policy Management, and Windows Desktop Enterprise Support.

Mr. Ortiz has worked in IT for state and local government agencies since 2017 including the State's Office of Systems Integration, Nevada County and, most recently, the City of Roseville.

Mr. Ortiz started on August 16, 2023, as part of our IT team, and we are thrilled to have him join us.

Additionally, I am pleased to announce our new Assistant Executive Director: Administrative Services: Cristina Bardasu, who will begin working at the Commission on Monday, September 24, 2023.

Ms. Bardasu earned her Bachelors in Business Administration from the University of Economy, Romania after which she attended the University of Law, Romania for a year. And, she earned her Certificate of Bookkeeping from Sunrise Tech Center and her Certificate of Completion of Real Estate Courses from Accredited Real Estate Schools.

Cristina is coming to us from the Department of Education, Tobacco-Use Prevention Education Program, where she has served as an Staff Services Manager I since 2018 and led and supervised a team working on budget, contracts, grants, personnel, legislation, and planning.

Prior to her promotion to management she served briefly as an AGPA in a lead capacity working on budgeting, administrative, analytical, and technical assistance support for the Foster Youth Services Coordinating Program.

And, for those who have served on or participated in Commission hearings for a while, you might remember Cristina also worked at the Commission from January 2016 to May 2017 where she adeptly handled the Commission's budgeting and accounting functions, including establishing new systems and means of tracking critical information. She also

prepared a statewide cost estimate and was a lot of fun for Commission staff to work with. We are delighted to have her as a new member of our executive team.
