## EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Proposed 2022 Hearing Calendar, Workload Update, and Tentative Agenda Items for the December 2021 and January 2022 Meetings (info/action)

#### I. PROPOSED 2022 HEARING CALENDAR (action)

Commission meetings are generally held on the fourth Fridays of odd months, unless they conflict with a holiday. In 2022, the fourth Friday in November is a holiday, therefore the first Friday of December is proposed for this hearing.
