A. Informal Conference

On September 25, the Commission staff will host an informal conference requested by the claimant in *Emergency Communications in Non-English Languages*, 25-TC-03.

B. State Personnel Board Compliance Review

On September 10, the Commission staff received notice that the State Personnel Board would be commencing their compliance review of staff's records. This review has been conducted every three years since at least 2012. Staff is currently collecting documents for submission and expects the process to conclude within the next few months. In 2023, there were two findings regarding missing documentation that required a corrective action response. To prevent these issues from occurring, staff updated policies, revised on-boarding schedules, and calendared documentation completion dates, which are enforced.
