Re: Request for Clarification of Pleading and Second Notice of Incomplete Test Claim

Criminal Procedure: Discrimination, 24-TC-02 Statutes 2022, Chapter 739, Section 1 (AB 256); Penal Code Section 745 County of Los Angeles, Claimant

Dear Mr. Lemus and Mr. Valdez:

On December 19, 2024, the County of Los Angeles (claimant) filed the above-captioned Test Claim. Upon review, Commission on State Mandates (Commission) staff found the Test Claim to be incomplete, and on January 17, 2025, notified the claimant. On January 30, 2025, the claimant filed documents to cure the Test Claim. Upon review, Commission staff found this Test Claim to be complete and retained the original filing date of December 19, 2024, in accordance with section 1183.1(f) of the Commission's regulations (California Code of Regulations, Title 2).

On February 18, 2025, Commission staff issued the Notice of Complete Test Claim on the above-captioned matter based upon the pleading of Statutes 2022, Chapter 739, Section 1 (AB 256); Penal Code section 745.¹

Request for Clarification of Pleading and Second Notice of Incomplete Test Claim

Government Code section 17553(b)(1) requires Test Claims to identify the *specific* sections of the executive order alleged to contain a mandate *and* a detailed description of the new activities mandated by the state. The *Test Claim Form* identifies Statutes 2022, Chapter 739, Section 1 (AB 256); Penal Code section 745.² The *Narrative* identifies Penal Code section 745(j)(3)³ and section 1473(e).⁴ In addition, the *Declaration* expressly identifies section 1473(e) as requiring that "the court 'shall' appoint counsel if the petitioner requests counsel and the petitioner cannot afford counsel."

Therefore, pursuant to additional legal review, Commission staff finds that both Penal Code sections 745(j)(3) and 1473(e), as amended by Statutes 2022, chapter 739, are

properly pled in the *Narrative* and *Declaration* but are not properly pled on the *Test Claim Form*.

If you intend to plead both Penal Code sections 745(j)(3) and 1473(e), as amended by Statutes 2022, chapter 739, please revise the *Test Claim Form* in *Section 4* to match the pleading in both the *Narrative* and *Declaration*.

Retaining Your Original Filing Date

To retain the original filing date of December 19, 2024, please file your revised *Test Claim Form* within 30 days of the date of this letter by **5:00 p.m. on April 11, 2025**. If a complete test claim is not received within 30 calendar days from the date of this letter, the executive director may disallow the original test claim filing date. (Cal. Code Regs., tit. 2, § 1183.1(f).)

As provided in the Commission's regulations, a real party in interest may appeal to the Commission for review of the actions and decisions of the executive director. Please refer to California Code of Regulations, title 2, section 1181.1(c).

You are advised that the revised Test Claim is required to be filed on a form prescribed by the Commission and shall be digitally signed, using the digital signature technology and authentication process contained within the Commission forms. Refer to https://www.csm.ca.gov/dropbox.shtml on the Commission's website for electronic filing instructions. (Cal. Code Regs., tit. 2, § 1181.3(c)(2).) If e-filing would cause the filer undue hardship or significant prejudice, filing may occur by first class mail, overnight delivery or personal service only upon approval of a written request to the executive director. (Cal. Code Regs., tit. 2, § 1181.3(c)(3).)
